

The primary goals of Multisystemic Therapy (MST®) are to reduce criminal activity and antisocial behavior (i.e. substance abuse) at a cost savings by decreasing incarceration and out-of-home placements.

In 2017, of the MST cases that tracked substance abuse outcomes,



80% had no arrests during treatment



Drug-related arrests of 64% compared to a control group MST youth reduced by 64% during a 14-year follow-up study⁴

MST features the largest body of evidence, by far, of successful interventions for high risk youth
